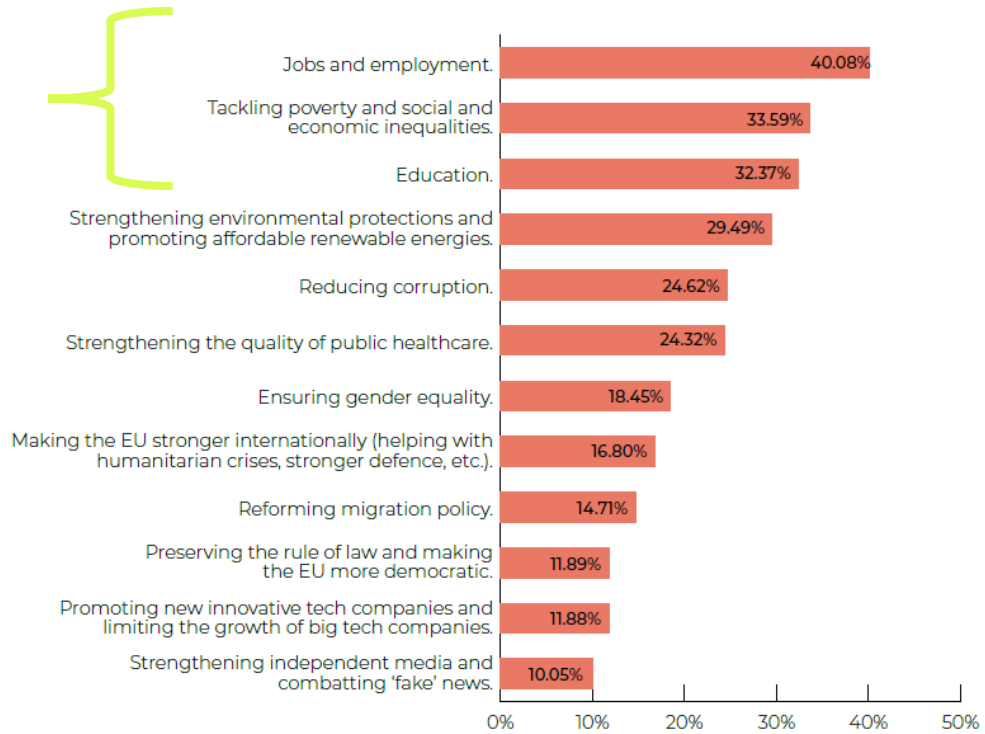

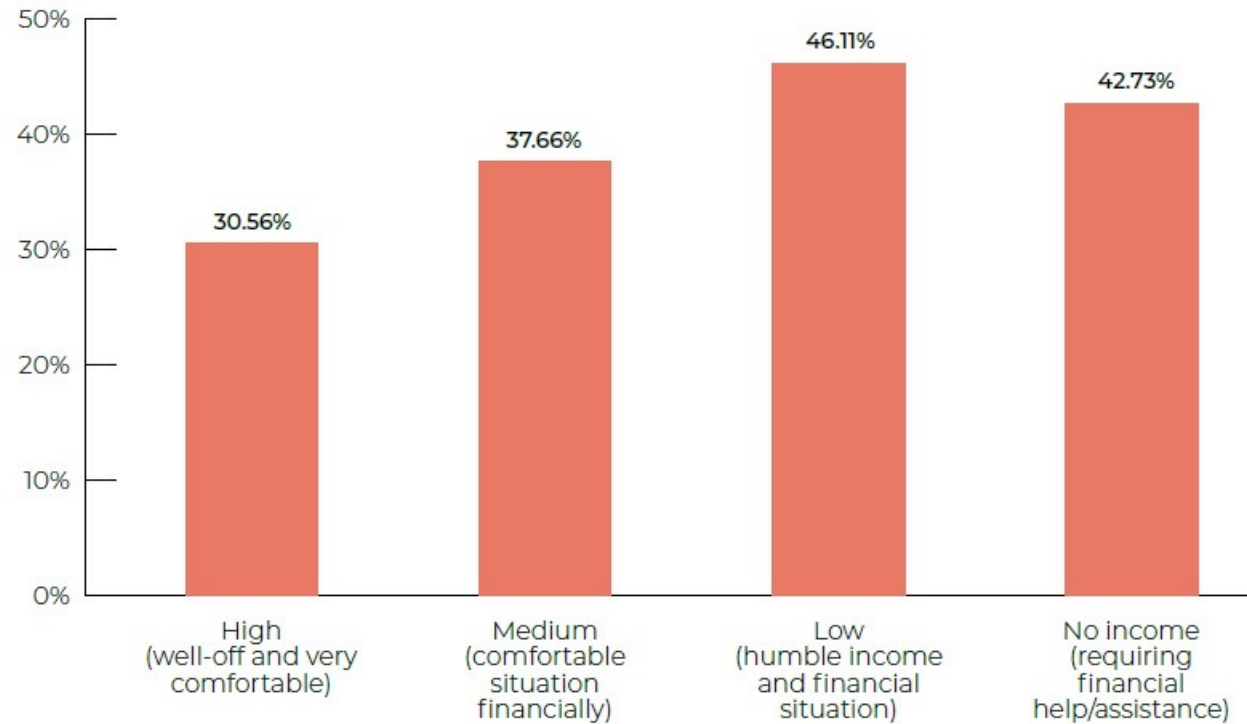

69% in favour of EU ensuring access to **decent and affordable housing**

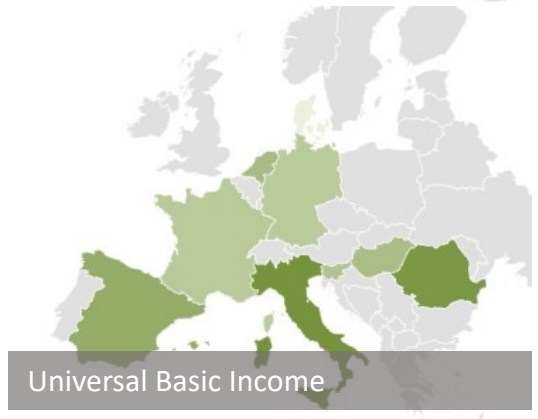
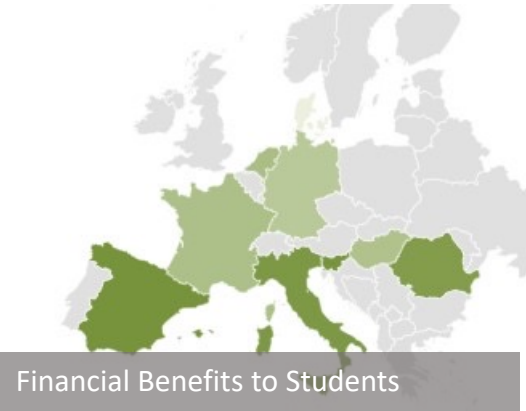


67% in favour of the EU getting more involved in **supporting children in need**



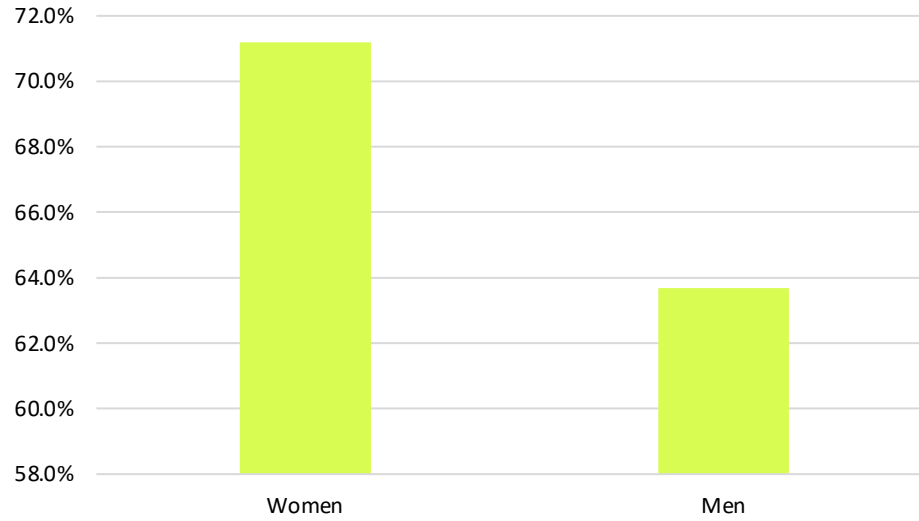
57% in favour of EU overseeing access to **unemployment benefits**

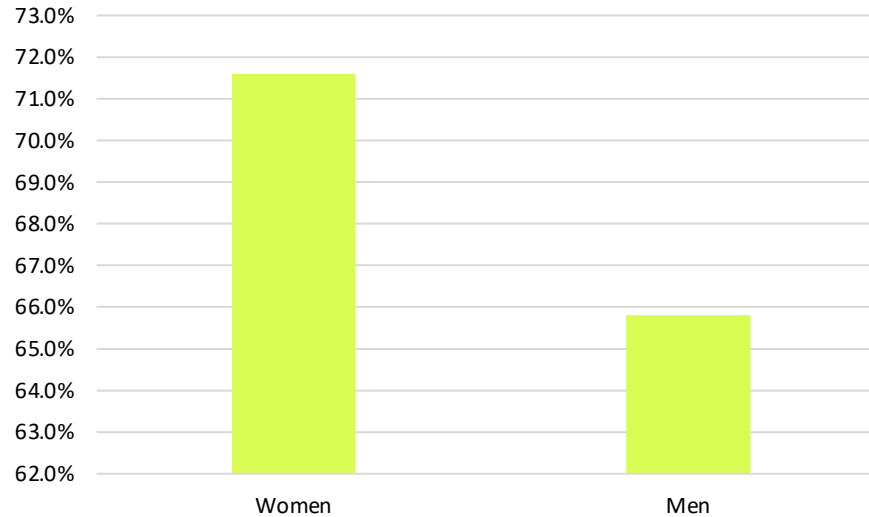

An example: "The EU should get more involved in supporting children in need in Europe."



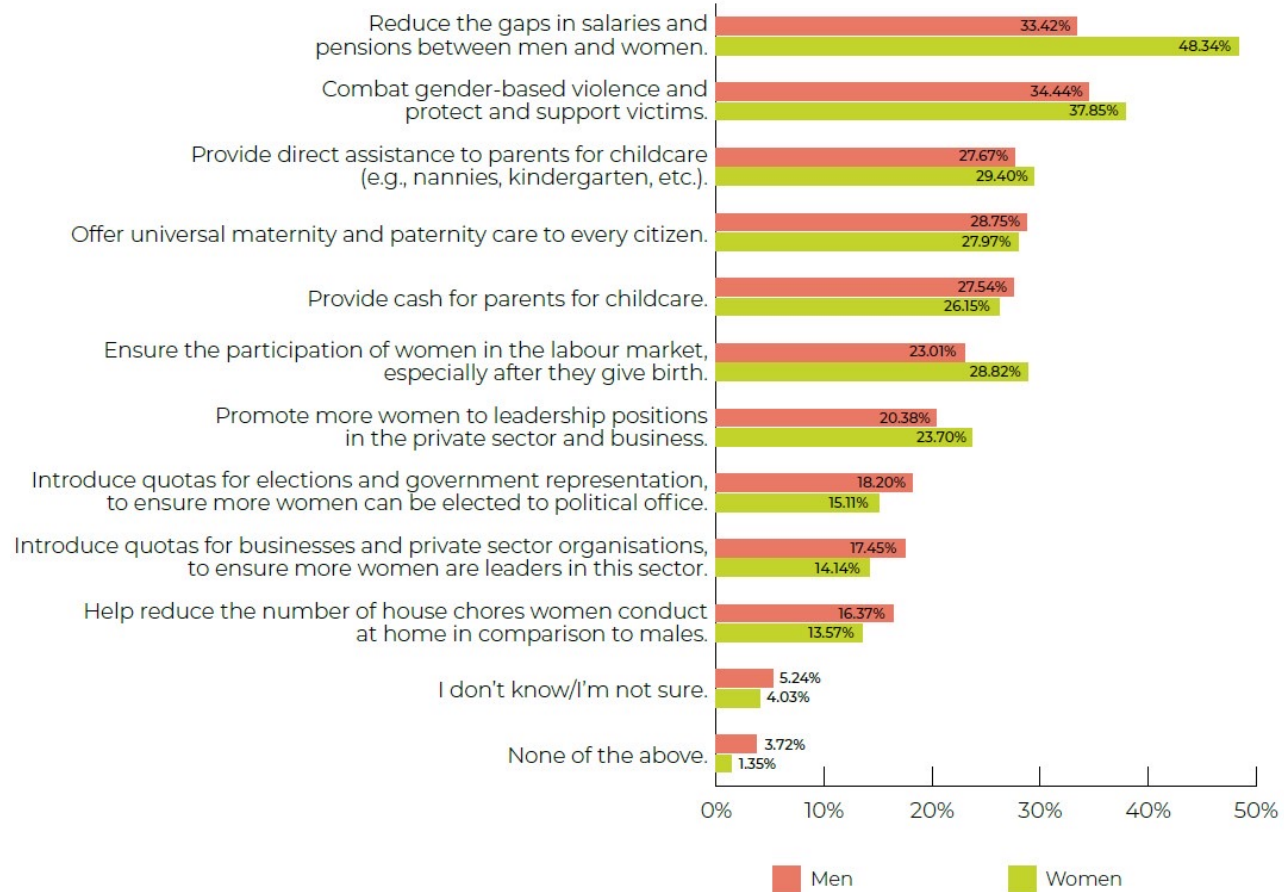
An example: "The EU should ensure access to decent and affordable housing to all citizens."

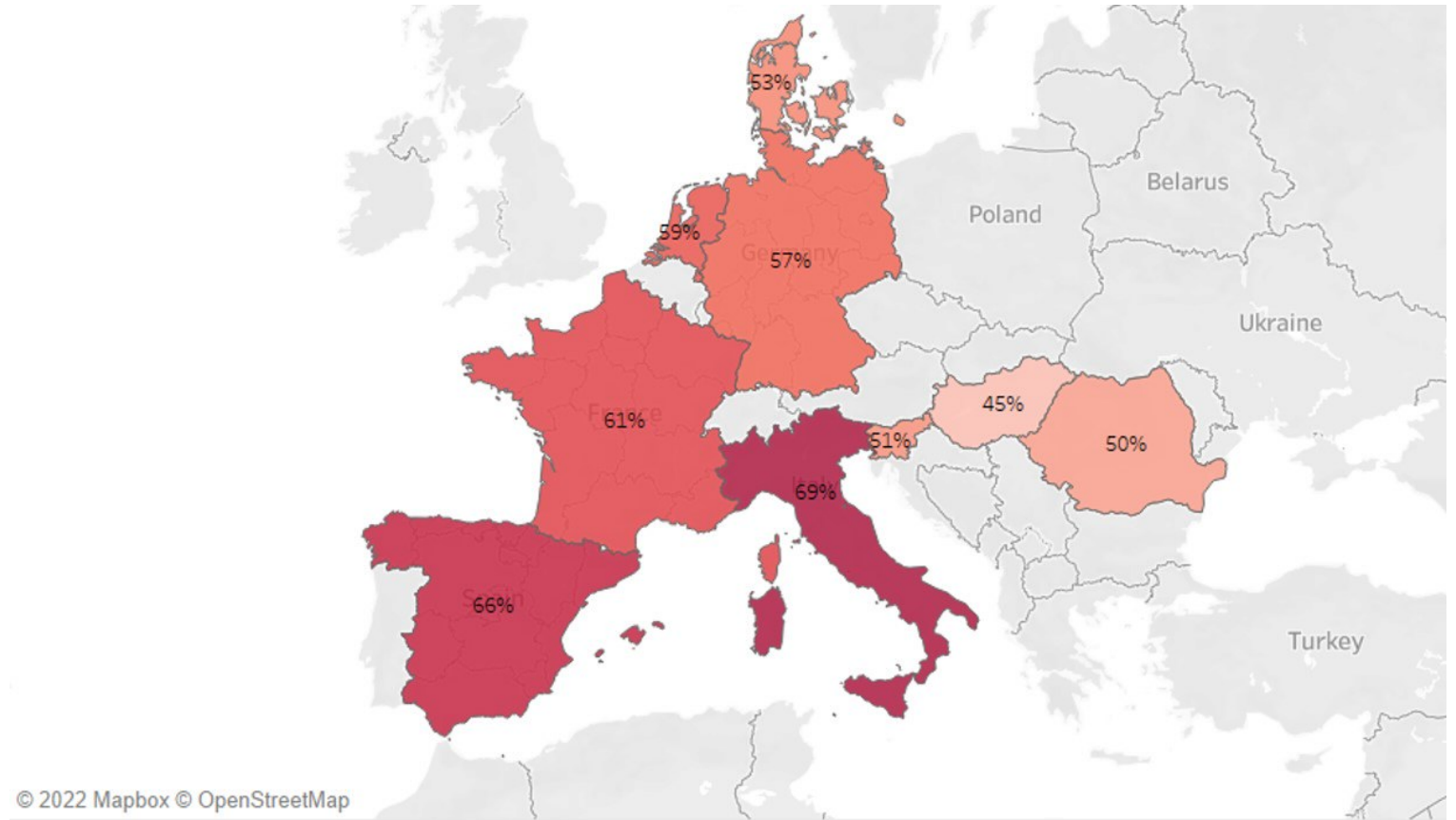

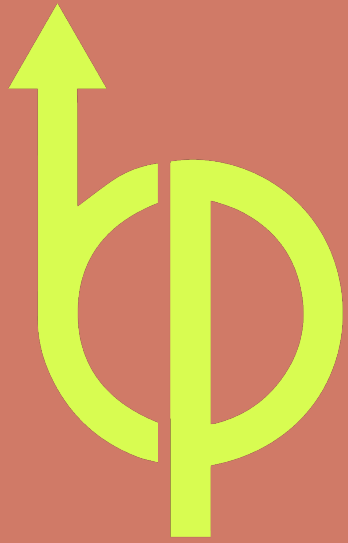
